Self-reflection. Digital portfolios act as virtual time capsules and can be excellent tools for student self-reflection. If you're asked to create a digital portfolio at the start of the school year, chronicle your work and accomplishments and document hurdles you encounter. At the end of the term, you can review, analyze, assess, and reflect on all that you have achieved over the academic year. Building a case. Portfolios traditionally are used as a body of evidence to support why a job seeker is qualified for a position. Now, digital portfolios can be used to showcase *any* topic that's part of a class assignment or research. A project on global warming can include uploaded photo evidence of changing

weather on neighborhoods, video of waste on beaches, statistical reports, and sounds bites from area authorities. The result: an organized case study that helps foster presentation skills.

Special needs. Non-traditional learners and students who struggle with conventional learning methods, such as reading and writing, can benefit from the use of e-portfolios for grading and assessment. The digital format and media such as photos and videos can help you develop oral and written skills and better communicate your thoughts.

Sharing. Portfolios are a great way to share information with viewers other than employers. For example, as a film major you can share the first edit, storyboard, and set design for a film project with peers or mentors for feedback and collaboration. For parents, your e-portfolio can affirm your hard work in the classroom throughout the academic year. Plus, some teachers/instructors may opt to share classroom updates via digital portfolios rather than post on public social media sites.

Future-oriented thinking. Research shows that classroom guidance and faculty engagement throughout the portfolio process can result in better student communication, interview, and self-promotional skills. So, work with your instructors to assess, tailor, and update your unique self-portrait. You'll be better prepared for that next opportunity, whether it be applying for internships, jobs, and training now, or seeking grants and salary increases later on.

A digital career portfolio reflects how you view yourself, how you want others to perceive you, and where you would like to head. It's your story to discover and tell: do both with intention and purpose. It's never too early.
