Graduation

The responsibility of fulfilling graduation requirements rests with the student. Students consult with their academic advisors to make certain that all requirements for the degree are met. It is the student's responsibility to obtain and file an 'Application for Degree' in the Registrar's Office. Filing dates: February 15 for August completion, June 15 for December completion and October 15 for May completion.

Residency Requirement

The final 30 credits of coursework must be taken at Eastern, including at least 15 credits in the major, unless more are required by the major department. Credits earned from CLEP or Credit for Lifelong Learning cannot be applied toward the residency requirement.

Upper Division Requirement

Within the 120 credits for the baccalaureate 60 credits must be numbered at the 300-400 level. Juniors and Seniors must receive faculty advisor's approval to register for 100 level courses
